Dear Parents,

On January 16 the Virginia Beach City Public Schools released the news that sixty-three Beach schools earned awards for excellence. Eight schools were named for receiving the prestigious Governor’s Award for Education Excellence and thirty-nine schools received the 2009 Board of Education’s Excellence Award, but the schools were not named. It was after Rosemont Forest’s leadership team discussed pursuing recognitions and honors that I visited the Virginia Department of Education website and learned Rosemont Forest had earned this award. Congratulations to the students, teachers, and parents for earning this honor. The Board of Education’s Excellence Award recognizes schools which meet state and federal benchmarks for at least two consecutive years and make significant progress toward state goals for increased student achievement and expanded educational opportunities set by Governor Kaine and the Board. Way to go!

The Virginia Beach City Public Schools will hold it’s first-ever Parent Connection Seminar on February 7 from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. at Landstown High School. Dr. Gerald Newmark is the keynote speaker and the seminar is free. The title of the seminar is “Raising Emotionally Healthy Children.” Parents will learn that from birth to young adulthood, all children share five critical emotional needs: to feel respected, to feel important, to feel accepted, to feel included, and to feel secure. Dr. Newmark will provide parents with practical tools and concepts to positively interact with their children to help them become emotionally healthy, young people. Classroom Happenings

Kindergarten

January was a “cool” month for kindergarten. We read stories about snow, hibernation, Martin Luther King and the Chinese New Year. In math, we are counting to 100 by ones, two's, five's and ten's, solving addition and subtraction stories using white boards, and sorting blocks by their attributes. Our writing is improving daily with the use of our word wall. We have also discussed community helpers and careers. Our “100th Day of School” is quickly approaching and we will celebrate then as well as on Valentine's Day. February also means learning about George Washington, Abraham Lincoln, and Groundhog's Day. We have much to discover in February!!!



1st Grade

January marked the completion of a great first semester. We have just begun Unit 4 in our reading series...Favorite Things Old

and New and continue to study vowel sounds and word patterns. Reading practice both at home and at school is the key to reading growth, especially with first graders. We are also pleased to see such progress in the children's writing. In math we will continue the spiral and work on addition and subtraction facts, fact families, telling and solving number stories, and introduce the quarter. We will begin to study animals in science, continue to learn about famous Americans and introduce maps and globes in social studies. February will be a month full of learning fun in first grade as we will celebrate Groundhog's Day, the 100th school day, Valentine's Day, President's Day, Famous African Americans and dental health. WOW!!

Second Grade

Can you believe we are already half way through the school year?!?! This month we will be studying several famous Americans and talking about how they have impacted our life today. We are planning many science experiments around magnetism this month also. Please encourage your child to read nightly! Ask your child questions about the events and characters of the story and also ask them to make connections to personal experiences from what they have read. Math is beginning to get harder and harder...please practice basic addition and subtraction facts with your child weekly. From this point forward in writing, we will be expecting detailed sentences that begin with a capital letter and end with the correct punctuation. Thanks for all your support!

Third Grade

It is hard to believe that we are half way through the school year. Third grade has been busy collecting Box-Tops to help support our school. Please continue to bring in Box-Tops throughout the year. Please encourage reading and writing at home. Our goal is to read 25 minutes a day to help build fluency. Encourage your child to retell what they have been reading. We are finishing up our Geography Unit in Social Studies and will begin our Science unit on Investigating Different Environments. Please continue to review daily with your child. In math we are finishing Unit 6 on Geometry and will start Unit 7 on Multiplication and Division. It is important to review the multiplication facts on a daily basis. Reviewing your child's agenda every night will keep you notified of important work and things happening around the school. The students are looking forward to our Young Chef's Academy field trip in February. Please remind your child to pack a lunch and a drink for that day! We are in need of snack baggies. If you are able to pick up a box and send it in, we would greatly appreciate it. Thank you for your continued support with your child's education. You play an important role in the education of your child, and you are beneficial to your child's success in school.

Fourth Grade

It is hard to believe that half of the year is over! We have many fun activities and projects planned for the rest of the year. In science we are finishing up our unit on Force and Motion, and are eager to start learning more about electricity and magnetism. We are planning on conducting more experiments to help prepare for the science fair in April. In social studies we are exploring the western part of the country and will eventually work our way through the south and back to our beautiful home state of Virginia. In math we are learning about the wonderful world of fractions, and looking at probability. All of the students are excited about the new AR period, and we hope our students will continue to read in their spare time. We are looking forward to hearing the Virginia Symphony this month on our field trip. Thank you parents for the great year so far!

Fifth Grade

Matter, matter everywhere and what is its form? Fifth graders are busy answering this question and many more concerning matter, elements, and atoms. Science Fair experimentation is also a major focus of every student. They should be using the due dates provided by their classroom teacher to complete this important project. Plotting along in math we'll learn how to represent data on different graphs, while continuing to dig deeper into fractions with addition and subtraction of fractions and mixed numbers. We're diligently preparing for the Writing SOL as our skills will soon be put to the test. Was slavery the real cause of the Civil War? What are State's Rights and what was worth fighting for? These questions along with many others will be discussed as we begin the American Civil War. Don't make any plans for March 10th because we will be taking a field trip to Pamplin Historical Park to explore the Civil War first hand.
